Hazard Mitigation Overview

• The 2017 Somerset County Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) is in the plan update process. The 2017 Somerset County HMP is available for review at the project's website: <u>www.somersetmdhazardplan.org</u>.

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- FEMA Requirements:
 - FEMA requires hazard mitigation plans to be updated every five (5) years.
 - Stakeholder/public engagement is vital throughout all stages of the plan development process to be approved by MDEM & FEMA.
 - For municipalities to be covered under the Somerset County HMP, they must participate throughout the planning process and formally adopt the plan.

Hazard Mitigation is any action taken to permanently reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and their property from the effects of hazards.

- Note: it is recommended that municipalities complete the Municipal Questionnaire (provided via fillable PDF form), the Municipal Survey (online), and provide recommendations for mitigation projects.
- Cost effective
 - Natural hazard mitigation provides the nation \$6 in benefit for every \$1 invested.

Project Timeline

- The initial project team meeting was held in April 2022, where stakeholders (i.e., HMPC) were identified and discussed.
 - The HMPC will meet throughout the planning process in addition to small/targeted group meetings that will be scheduled as needed.
 - e.g., municipal group(s) may meet separately to discuss topics specific to municipalities.
- Draft chapters will be sent to HMPC members and placed on the project website for public review as they are completed. A full draft plan for stakeholder review will be made available in October/November 2022 (refer to page 6 for project timeline).

Stakeholder & Public Participation

- Stakeholders from a broad cross-section of the community were invited to participate, including municipalities.
 - Stakeholders may have public outreach initiatives that pair well with hazard mitigation and resilience. SP&D requests that stakeholders provide details of these public outreach initiatives for collaboration and documentation (e.g., agenda, brief description of the meeting and how the 2022 Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan Update process was discussed).
 - SP&D is requesting photos, data, and ideas from stakeholders as they relate to hazard mitigation and/or natural hazard events in Somerset County.

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Hazard Identification & Risk Assessment (HIRA)

- Hazards identified within the HMP:
 - Natural Hazards: Flood, Hurricane, Sea Level Rise, Shoreline Erosion, Epidemic, Drought & Extreme Heat, Thunderstorm, High Wind, Winter Storm, Wildfire, Tornado, Earthquake.
 - **Man-Made/Technological Hazards:** Cyber Attack, HazMat, Major Transportation Accident, Dam Failure.
- To assess the hazard risk for the natural hazards identified in this Plan Update, a composite score method was undertaken. The composite score method was based on a

A **risk** is the chance, high or low, that any hazard will occur and the severity or impact from that hazard.

blend of quantitative and qualitative factors extracted from the National Centers for Environmental Information (NCEI) database, and other available data sources. These included:

- Historical impacts, in terms of human lives and property;
- Geographic extent;
- Historical occurrence;
- Future probability; and,
- o Community perspective.
- The following weighted risk factors were used in the equation below to determine the composite risk score for each identified hazard.
 - Equation: Composite Score = IN + DT + PD + CD + (GE*1.5) + EV + FP + (CP*1.5)
- Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (HIRA) results for the County.
